

## Barnes & Noble *nook*<sup>™</sup>

### Download free e-books from your library to the *nook*

Before you begin, you will need:

1. The *nook* and USB cable
2. Adobe Digital Editions software (free download from OCLN Digital Media Collection website) and an Adobe ID account (free from Adobe)

First, connect the *nook* to your computer with the USB cable.

Next, open Adobe Digital Editions. If this is your first time using the *nook* with Adobe Digital Editions the 'Device Setup Assistant' dialog box will display. If you have already authorized your *nook*, skip ahead to the next step.

Click “**Authorize Device**”.

Adobe Digital Editions activates the eBook device. Now you are ready to download the books you want to read. *Note that both Adobe Digital Editions and the eBook device must be activated with the same Adobe ID to transfer DRM-protected Adobe eBooks to the device.*

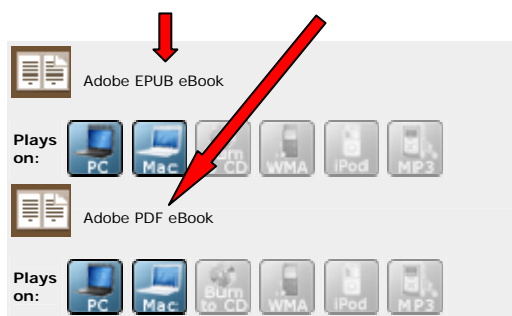
Go to the library catalog and log in using your library card number and PIN.

Click “**Download E-books and Audio.**”

You are now on the OCLN Digital Media Collection page. This online media catalog contains both audiobooks, which you listen to and ebooks, which you read.

There are two formats of eBooks. Both formats are compatible with the *nook*:

Adobe EPUB or Adobe PDF eBooks



## Finding a book in the online Digital Media Collection

Use the navigation bar on the left side of the screen to browse for eBook fiction and eBook nonfiction titles



There are two ways to search for books:

1. Browse the books in the catalog using the navigation bar on the left side of the screen
2. Search for specific books by title or author by using the Quick Search option.

Some books are always available for download, others can only be borrowed by one person at a time. If you only want to view books that are available now, click on Advanced Search and select "Only show titles with copies available".

## Select your books and download

If the book is currently available, you can download it by clicking “**Add to eBookBag**”

OR

If there is a specific book that you would like to download and it is not currently available, you can reserve it by clicking “**Place hold**”

When you find a book you want to download, check the right side of the screen to determine if the book is currently available for download.

Once you have added the books you want to download to your eBookBag:

Click “**Proceed to Checkout.**” The system will tell you how many titles you have out, and how many you may borrow.

Click “**Confirm Checkout.**”

Click “**Download.**”

A dialog box will pop up, asking “Do you want to Open or Save this file?” Select “**Open.**”

Now the book should open automatically in Adobe Digital Editions. If it does not open automatically, you can find the file on your computer and drag and drop it into your library.

In Adobe Digital Editions, go to library view by clicking the icon in the upper left side of the screen. To transfer the eBook onto the *nook*, drag and drop the file from the library to the *nook* icon located on the Bookshelves pane on the left side of the screen.

Remember to eject before disconnecting the USB cable from your computer.

Now you are ready to read your eBook on the *nook*!
